

National Reconciliation Week



This year's National Reconciliation Week theme is 'Be a voice for Generations'. It's a challenge to all Australians - individuals, families, communities, organisations and government - to be brave and tackle the unfinished business of reconciliation so we can make change for the benefit of all Australians.

National Reconciliation Week is a time for all Australians to learn about our shared histories, cultures and achievements and to explore how each of us can contribute to achieving reconciliation in Australia.

This week there was a whole school focus on Reconciliation Week, with students at CVPS engaging in a range of activities to understand the meaning of reconciliation and to explore how each of us can contribute to reconciliation in Australia.

Students across all year levels participated in yarning circles during their morning meetings. They read and viewed 'Finding our Heart' by Thomas Mayo, a story about the Uluru Statement for young Australians. Every student then completed a picture heart, demonstrating what a reconciled future and being a 'voice' means to them. This culminated in a whole school reflective 'heart gallery walk', where students had the opportunity to share their ideas about reconciliation.

National Simultaneous Story time

National Simultaneous Storytime (NSS) is held annually by the Australian Library and Information Association. Every year a picture book by an Australian author and illustrator is read simultaneously in libraries and schools across Australia. National Simultaneous Storytime aims to promote the value of reading and literacy as well as the fun of reading books.

This year's NSS storybook was 'The Speedy Sloth' written by Rebecca Young and illustrated by Heath McKenzie. Students at CVPS participated in NSS on Monday 22 May. After reading the book, students enjoyed taking part in a range of activities to further explore the theme of the story.

Djaril 3 joined in National Simultaneous Storytime in the library with our wonderful librarian, Mrs McKenzie. Mrs McKenzie read this year's book, "The Speedy Sloth", and handed out certificates of participation. Thanks, Mrs McKenzie!











Classroom News

For the last few weeks, students from Years 1 to 6 have been working on their ukulele skills. For many of our Year 1 students, this was their first time playing a ukulele. They learnt some of the basic skills associated with ukulele playing including how to hold it and how to strum. Both the Year 1s and 2s learnt how to play a C major chord so that they could strum along to a song called, "Are You Strumming?"

Students in Years 3, 4 and 5 learnt how to play the C and F major chords so that they could strum along to the verse of "Imagine."

The Year 6 students learnt how to play the F major and A minor chords so that they could strum along to "Eleanor Rigby."

For reconciliation week, all students learnt how to strum and sign along to a song called "Wanjoo" which was created by two local Indigenous artists, Gina Williams, and Guy Ghouse. The lyrics for this song are in Noongar (the local Indigenous language).

Sorry Day

Students in Moodjar 3 have been learning about the significance of National Sorry Day in the lead up to National Reconciliation Week. National Sorry Day remembers and acknowledges the mistreatment of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people who were forcibly removed from their families and communities, known as the 'Stolen Generation'.

Students examined the history of the Stolen Generations and reflected on how they could contribute to the healing process. They worked in pairs to create posters to promote moving forward towards national reconciliation.

Students in Moodjar 4 used the medium of clay to create an artwork inspired by aboriginal symbols as part of their study of Indigenous Australian culture. Students created clay sculptures, exploring the idea of using Aboriginal symbols to communicate ideas about people and things that are important to them.

In Djaril 3, we were very excited to celebrate 65 Roses Day with our wonderful classmate, Norah, who lives with Cystic Fibrosis. We eagerly purchased roses and painted a rose garden mural together, using the bottom of a celery to get a rose-like shape. We then gathered for a whole-class photo to remember the wonderful day we had.





Talk for Writing

The Year 1's discovered some strange items left in the Djaril wet area on Tuesday! There was a giant pair of reading glasses, some giant footprints and a golden egg. We gathered together to infer what had happened and decided that a giant had visited in the night and left his items behind! Suddenly, a familiar giant entered the wet area to collect his glasses and golden egg - it was Mr Thewlis!

For the remainder of Term 2, we will be using Jack and the Beanstalk as our model text to learn how to write warning tales. Thank you Mr Thewlis for helping us make our 'hook' exciting!


